


## Wooden Feet – Fixing Options

Make sure you choose the best fixing type to suit your needs, a guide to some of our most popular fixings are shown below.



Correctly fitted from the opposing side of the frame rail, a steel fixing with teeth to securely hold in place. The most commonly used (and often misused fixing for furniture legs.

Also known as a Type J insert nut, countersunk holes in the flange of this product allow the nut to be fixed in place with screws.

A die cast fixing featuring a self tapping external thread to secure into the frame. Available in a selection of thread sizes and lengths. A barbed outer on this fixing allows for speedier 'knock-in' fitting to frames.
